

CBH Vision Statement

To better aid the Offeror’s concepts, CBH has provided the following statement concerning their initial thoughts for the Crisis Services Center (CSC) design.

“We want to build a CSC that demonstrates the staff and the services provided within are welcoming, inclusive, compassionate, and free of judgement. The space should feel safe, tranquil, soothing, and free of distractions. The building should demonstrate that recovery is a community priority and an investment in its people and their support systems, who serve as partners in the recovery process. The CSC will house services new to our community that are delivered in different and innovative ways. For individuals and their support systems, the building should represent a path to positive change.”

As for character, CBH does not want the building to look like an institution nor should it resemble Eastern State Hospital or other inpatient hospitals. Further, it should not look like a converted/repurposed retail space, a jail, or a police station.

CBH would like the facility to be reflective of its community, so the styles should be fit within James City County/Williamsburg. CBH wants the entrance to be welcoming, perhaps including a circular driveway, or a covered entrance, or some other way to make a statement of both welcome and importance.
